# Our Careers Programme

Our Careers Programme at Woodhouse is designed to give students meaningful encounters with employers and employees whilst also raising their aspirations and developing key employability skills. Students in KS2 are introduced to different career and education options, whilst KS3 pupils build on this knowledge and take part in careers challenges.

We base our provision on the nationally recognised 'Gatsby benchmarks.'
